Border News

Mexican Border Authorities are still not allowing the transport of beans, potatoes, poultry meat and eggs into Mexico. In July, the entire caravan of trucks was turned around at the Mexican boarder. We offloaded these products from each truck on the U.S. side and sent back one full truck of beans and one full of potatoes before we could enter Mexico. These products constitute some of the most important staples that we can provide to over 2600 individuals in orphanages and missions in Mexico. We are checking with Mexican border authorities on a regular basis concerning the approvals needed at the Mexican border for these items. We have had meetings with US officials, the Mexican Consulate, and import brokers to try to find the right solutions to allow us bring the food once again for those who are hungry. May God's glory show bright and pure in all things.

Trip Reports

There have been many things happening with MCCA during October and November. The first item needs your continuous prayer for those involved. On Saturday, November 9, we were on our regular monthly support trip into Baja Mexico when one of the MCCA trucks was involved with a head-on collision with another pickup truck. The accident left a Mexican driver dead at the scene; his son and two of our men were seriously injured. The two MCCA members received follow-up surgery and are recovering. Please pray for the families, and the healing of all involved, especially for God's compassion and comforting love for the Mexican family who lost a loved one in this tragedy.

The trip on Saturday, December 7, went very well. 200 Beanny Baby gifts were distributed and the Redlands Rotary distributed 225 "shoe box" gifts at 3 orphanages. Keep those served and the servers in your prayers.
